The following represents a partial list of academic-historical books on U. S. empire, published between January 2010 and April 2024. It is meant as a follow-up and supplement to the works footnoted in my 2011 article “Power and Connection: Imperial Histories of the United States in the World.”

To keep the list manageable, I’ve included only books here, where obviously many compelling scholarly articles have been published on U. S. imperial histories, including by the authors listed below. In the interests of disciplinary cohesion, nearly all the books here are works of history, where rich scholarships on U. S. empire have been developed in American Studies, ethnic studies, anthropology, sociology, political science, geography, and international relations. And where many works on U. S. empire address broad, general audiences, I have prioritized books by scholars, directed primarily towards other scholars.

While extensive, the list is not intended to be comprehensive. Like all scholars and readers, my awareness is undoubtedly limited, and I’m certain this list is incomplete. (Please feel free to email me at paul.a.kramer@vanderbilt.edu with suggestions and updates.)
